Double oval shaped pedestal table in the style of Adam Weisweiler In gilded bronze and onyx transition style Circa 1880 Headband in varnished walnut colored sheet, decorated with a frieze Resting on 4 bronze feet ending with claw feet and joined by a tablet of crotch shape kidney The onyx trays are surrounded by a gallery openwork In very good condition * Adam Weisweiler (Rhineland, 1744-1820), master cabinetmaker in Paris in 1778, established in the Faubourg Saint-Antoine, had made a specialty refined little furniture, with fine and nervous lines, often adorned with lacquers and porcelains: pedestal tables, tables with books, happiness of the day, consoles ... He became the supplier of the Court of France, of Marie-Caroline of Austria Queen consort of Naples, of Maria Feodorovna,
