Large anthropomorphic pitcher in ceramic or enamelled sandstone representing a pansu character, signed J. Coville * and dated 1974, vintage twentieth century. This pitcher is in good condition. Signed and dated in the ass. A report: tiny enamelling defects, slight wear of time, see photos. * Jacky Coville born March 20, 1936 in Sèvres. After a career as an aeronautical engineer, he left his design office to devote himself to ceramics. In 1976, Jacky Coville bought, in Biot, the workshop of Roland Brice who was the ceramist of Fernand Léger. Jacky Coville exhibits since the 1970s, in France and around the world. His works have been presented since 1976 in Japan, Germany, Belgium and are regularly exhibited in Italy. With many awards, such as the gold medal of Faenza or Vallauris, his sculptures
