BIOGRAPHY Born May 3, 1933 in Livarot (Calvados). Died in 2016. 20th century French. Painter, mixed technique, collage. He studied in Paris, the soft waist at the Ecole Boule, continued his training at the Ecole des Beaux-Arts in Paris between 1954 and 1959. He obtained the first Second Prize of Rome in 1958 and was resident at Casa Velasquez in 1959-1960. And in 1960-1961. In 1960, he founded the May workshop at Malakoff, which prepared for the Ecole des Beaux-Arts and the Ecole des Arts Décoratifs. He collaborated in the counter-magazine created by Tony Cartano between 1971 and 1974 and worked at the
