Description

Barava Kuwojo ring in fossilized holy water font. Origin from Choiseul Island, archipelago of the Solomon Islands. This ring surmounted by a stylized figure representing a bluish-crested pigeon endemic to Choiseul Island could be exchanged as currency, however it is reported that only the chiefs would have worn around their neck this clan symbol specific to a land during meetings intertribal, in particular for exchanges and sharing of currencies. This type of barava ring is represented on the two dollar Solomones bill and the flag of the province of Choiseul. This type of barava ring is relatively rare moreover is by its dimensions also. Object collected in situ in the 90s. Period estimated in the first half of the 20th century. It is brought to the attention of bidders that some countries do not allow imported
