Color lithograph entitled "walk in the Bois de Boulogne Attelage à la daumont"; by Louis Emmanuel Soulange - Teissier (1814-1898) after Jules de Bonnemaison (1809-1865). This Lithograph has kept beautiful colors, and sold framed. Louis Emmanuel Soulange Teissier, born July 08, 1814 in Amiens (80) and died February 12, 1898 in Milon la Chapelle (78) at the age of 83 years. At 16 he entered a Parisian printer as an apprentice typographer and then a page designer at Panckouke. He then devoted himself to painting and then lithography. In 1841 he obtained a 3rd class medal at the Salon des Artistes. In 1857 and 1858 he was again laureate of the same salon and was awarded a 2nd class medal; Upon his return from Spain in 1855, he devoted himself to interpreting the works of
