Turquoise glazed vessels first appeared from the Yuan dynasty (1279-1368) and continued to be popular in the Ming dynasty (1368-1644), especially on 'fahua' vessels. Turquoise monochromes produced in the Ming dynasty however, are few and far between, and only started being mass produced in the Kangxi period.

The turquoise glazes were more commonly found on non-imperial pieces more suited for the
