CAMILLE DESMOULINS

Cane-sword made up of a malacca rod finished with an iron ferrule and an ivory-tipped handle. The triangular steel blade is hidden in the rod. It is adorned with a deep inscription in acid: " LE CONVENTIONNEL CAMILLE DESMOULINS 1794".

Total length 93 cm, handle-blade 73 cm Epoca 1794

Very Good Condition (hair on the ivory and small crack at the entrance of the blade) visible in the photos.

Camille Desmoulins born March 3, 1760 died April 5, 1794

Lawyer, journalist, one of the main orators of the French Revolution, known for his famous speech of July 12, 1789 at the Palais Royal which Dealer
