The Cortendorf Manufaktur was founded in 1890 by Julius Griesbach in Coburg-Cortendorf. In addition to decorative ceramic items, they also had a large selection of figurative ceramics.

Sculptor and model maker Albert Strunz has introduced new design elements since 1954. The same is true of the well-known wall masks he has introduced since 1958. Since then, the wall mask repertoire has grown steadily throughout the
