As a young man, he was an accordionist at public balls, a singer and lived off odd jobs. Following a strike in the factory where he was employed, he decided to leave Paris to

His favorite themes were flowers, boats, cars, planes, trains, churches, whales, fish, musical instruments... Discovered by the painter Claude Massé who devoted an article to him in the Fascicules de Art Brut, in 1982. His work is now in the collections of LaM (Lille), Art Brut (Lausanne) and the Musgrave Kinley Outsider Art Collection (Manchester).
