From the crayfish's mouth comes out a jet of water. The background of the scene decorated with a multitude of leaves and trees.

Jacques Houzeau (1624 Bar-le-Duc - Paris 1691) French sculptor was appointed sculptor of the King in 1663 and made several works that the Palace of Versailles owns and that Thomassin engraved.
