

"This famous edition was the most complete, the most beautiful and the best ordered that had appeared until then of the Works of Voltaire. It is under the typographical point of view that Beaumarchais deserves praise". (in Brunet). "The work results from the philosophical debates held in Cirey relating to reasoning reason, to the assertions of Locke and Leibnitz, to the historical existence of humanity. Voltaire pleads for theism: according to him, it is necessary to enlighten men and cure them of theological insanities. (R. Mortier, in Voltaire Dictionary, p. 74).
