



Boulle Style Chest Of Drawer Sfrom 19th C.



Description

This elegant chest of drawers embodies the opulence and artistry of the Napoleon III period in France (1852-1870). While not a true Boulle piece (crafted by the famed Parisian cabinetmaking family), it utilizes the Boulle marquetry technique to create a visually stunning and historically inspired piece.

Boulle Marquetry: The defining characteristic is the intricate marquetry work on the facade. This technique involves inlaying thin sheets of brass, tortoiseshell (or a convincing substitute), or other contrasting materials into a background of ebony or other fine wood. The design on this chest of drawers likely features scrolling foliage, floral motifs, or geometric patterns.

Materials: The chest is likely constructed from a wood frame with a black lacquered finish. The marquetry itself uses brass for the lighter elements and a darker material, possibly tortoiseshell or a convincing substitute, as the background.

Hardware: The hardware typically complements the overall design and might be made of bronze or a similar metal. Look for details like decorative mouldings along the edges, keyhole in the center of the drawers, and potentially ornamental handles or drawer pulls.
