

Nicola Forcella (1868-?) "Young Tunisian girl with earrings and tattoos" Pastel on paper, signed lower right, dimensions: 36 x 26 cm; Italian Orientalist Nicola Forcella (born December 2, 1850 in Castellaneta and died on an unknown date) was an Italian Orientalist painter. He had acquired the reputation of the best orientalist painter in Egypt in the 19th century<sup>1</sup>. Biography Nicola Forcella taught at the Khedivial School of Applied Arts in Egypt, where he was awarded the Imperial Order of Medjidie. He has a brother, Paolo (1868-?), who studied painting in Naples, and accompanied him to Egypt.
