Paris, and then acquired in 1885 the house Eugène Rousseau, porcelain and crystal dealer and editor. He operated the contents of the Rousseau's studio from 1886 until 1890 under the name "Maison Rousseau et Lévêillé réunies".

Lévêillé created models and executed them according to very precise instructions. His cracked and engraved vases on three layers of glass earned him a gold medal. Renamed "E. Lévêillé" after the death of Eugène Rousseau in 1890, the store was transferred in 1899 to 140 Faubourg Saint-Honoré in Paris. In 1902, Ernest Lévêillé joined the company Toy specialized porcelain and crystal wares, under the name "Maisons Toy et Lévêillé réunies". The property was then located at 10 rue de la Paix.
