The statuette represents a filiform female character with a hieratic appearance, standing on long legs with atrophied feet and resting on a small triangular base. The slender body has a small chest materialized by two circles in slight relief, a small umbilicus with the same aesthetic, the sex signified by a notch. Arms bent, detached from the body, palms facing outward in warning.
