They established a very proven track record during the late middle ages and then in the renaissance, these were the mercenary troops the Landsknecht were modelled on. While the Balisard was an extremely popular weapon through the middle ages, with many variations this set is Swiss. The sword is a short very robust fighting sword, with similar properties to a roman gladius. The hilt of the sword is comprised of a wooden grip and a. The guard is a short set of curved quillons facing inwards toward the handle. The pommel of the sword is an iron pommel cap, both the pommel
