Description

Set of two Patinated and Gilt Bronze Candlesticks, representing a Girl and a Satyreau, seated on Stumps. The two characters, with Chubby morphologies, are naked, and wearing Crowns of Golden Vines. The lower part of the body of the young Faun, as a faithful figure of the Greek Divinity, is that of a Goat. Each of these children holds in his hands two Horns of Plenty embellished with Vines. These arms of light are terminated by foliated Bobèches, themselves topped with Chalices, also ornate. It will be noted that these Candlestick parts are removable, to facilitate cleaning. These Bronzes rest on a White Marble, cut in Truncated and Fluted Columns. These first parts are themselves encamped on square bases with hollowed-out angles, and the edges underlined by golden strips. These
