Tebako or case for various accessories. Made of lacquered, gilded and carved wood. The decorative motifs include a large chrysanthemum flower with 16 petals (a symbol of the Japanese emperor and also a symbol of the sun, dignity, joy and the beginning of autumn), various objects and bats, which augurs well in the Far East. The bat in Chinese is a homonym of the word "fu" which means "good luck". It is also a symbol of longevity. Japan, Meiji era (1868-1912). Length 24 cm, width 19.5 cm, height 11.5 cm.
