The console is adorned on its tray with a cartouche framed by two mythological sea creatures, olive branches and a beaded garland. It rests on four curved feet decorated in the angles with olive branches.

This practice emerged around the middle of the 16th century and reached its peak in the 18th century. The main destinations were Italy, France, the Netherlands, Germany and Switzerland. Young people would buy art and antiques, and visit ancient Roman ruins as well the recently discovered Herculaneum and Pompeii. In the 18th and 19th centuries, the Grand Tour was made by artists, art amateurs, collectors and writers.
