Important wooden mask carved into an anthropomorphic face with a long beard It has the characteristic features of the culture: a long nose, protruding nostrils, eyes in the form of inverted triangles, small ears in relief on the temples, a beard in the form of a collar and a protuberance at the top. It is entirely covered with polychrome pigments, which refer in particular to facial paintings.
