Description

- Porcelain biscuit representing the gust of wind signed hollow on the terrace Hippolyte Moreau.
- Hippolyte François Moreau born in Dijon on April 1, 1832, second son of the sculptor and painter of Jean-Batiste Moreau, he came to work in Paris under the direction of the sculptor François Jouffroy (1806-1882) from Dijon and exhibited his first work at the Salon des Artistes Français in 1859, then he

exhibited regularly at the salon until 1914.

- He won a medal at the Universal Exhibition in Paris in 1878 and another at the Universal Exhibition in Paris in 1900.
- Most of his work includes figures of children and young women, mostly allegorical.
- He created many models in marble, plaster,
