This young woman is dressed in a dress with a deep neckline with a nice work of the sculptor in the drape, her hair is done in a bun and the features of her face are fine. It emerges from this bust a solar aura. Signature on the back F and G Pugi Firenze. Art Nouveau period around 1900. Significant weight, between 15 and 20 kg. Very good house condition, some impurities in the stone at the level of the neckline and a red spot on the back of the left shoulder.
