Patinated bronze sculpture of a young dancer by French sculptor Marius Jean Antonin Mercié. There is an author's signature. At the bottom - the name of the foundry - Moissoneur. Marius Jean Antonin Mercié (1845-1916) was an acclaimed French sculptor and painter who studied sculpture at the Ecole des Beaux-Arts in Paris under François Jouffroy (1806-1882) and Alexandre Falguière (1831-1900). in 1868 the sculptor won the Prix de Rome, and in 1872 received the Cross of the Legion of Honor and the First Class Medal for the sculpture of David, kept in the Musée d'Orsay in Paris. Mercié won the highest medals in 1889 and was elected to the Académie des Beaux-Arts and to a professorship at the Ecole des Beaux-Arts. He was also elected Grand Officer of the Legion of Honor, and in
