- Median folds, a few very rare short tears on the edges and at the junction of the median folds, some stains, the edges reinforced with a strip of paper. Frame with passe-partout

- Very large and rare plan of the city of Dunkirk with the ramparts of the city reinforced by Vauban, its port and the suburbs in the state it was in after the destruction of the fort Louis in 1714. The author probably belongs to a member

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of the Masse family, Claude Masse or one of his sons, geographers. - Following the peace of Utrecht of 1713, and the problems of Austrian enclaves along the northern border, it was decided to establish the statements of the maps of the northern borders, and this, from 1723 under the leadership of the engineer Claude Masse. In 1728, the towns of Saint-Omer, Cassel, Gravelines and Dunkirk were relieved.
