Description

Silver metal sculpture representing a rider. The knight is a chess piece, represented by a horse's head. The knight is the master of the early game and the trickiest piece in chess. His movement is irrational. On the ontological level, the rider being able to jump the obstacles, one can analyze the piece as the representation of the ardor, the passions and the heart. Its movement being irrational. Thus, the different parts can be seen as so many components of man: spirit, soul, body, intellect and heart. Finally, the movement of the pieces at right angles or at right angles (jumper) is obviously reminiscent of Masonic symbolism. Stamp under the base.
