



Pair Of Louis XV Allegorical Andirons

Description

Pair of mercury gilt bronze andirons; the wrought iron support bars.

Each of the andirons is made up of ample windings decorated with rockeries and foliage and ends at the end with a kind of architecture which extends into the backs of the cherubs and ends with a bouquet of branches.

Sitting on these pedestals, two cherubs hold in their hands, one a palette symbolizing painting, and the other a rolled up paper, an allegory of literature (or poetry). They each held in the other hand a brush and pen, now missing.

Borrowings from the rock taste, flourished from the years 1725-1730, these andirons express through the art of metal and more particularly that
