## Description

Tannhäuser by Louis Chalon (1866-1916), bronze on marble, signed L. Chalon.

The bronze sculpture "Tannhäuser" by Louis Chalon represents a scene from Richard Wagner's opera of the same name, where the character Tannhäuser is seduced by the goddess Venus during his visit to Venusberg, where the goddess resides.

Louis Chalon was a versatile artist, practicing as a painter, illustrator, goldsmith and sculptor. He studied with Jules-Joseph Lefebvre and Boulanger. His classically inspired paintings were exhibited in the salons of the Société des Artistes Français in Paris from 1880 to 1911.
