Signed and dated "31" lower right. Filippo De Pisis Italian poet and painter of the 20th century imposes himself with a pictorial style with light and spaced touches. He befriended the Italian artist Giorgio Chirico, one of the founding fathers of the metaphysical painting movement. Despite his interest in this innovative trend, De Pisis remains an autonomous artist detached from any artistic movement. The subjects of marine and urban scenes occupy an important place throughout his career. Living in Paris from 1925 until 1939, he nevertheless traveled to his native country, particularly to Venice, which he visited for the first time in 1924, where he stayed longer from 1943 to 1949. Filippo De Pisis has a special relationship with the city that has profoundly influenced his artistic work. The city of Venice
