Description

Élégant meat dish in sterling silver, dating from the end of the nineteenth century. It is manufactured by Aucoc in Paris. Engraved with the arms of the Dukes of Rohan-Chabot and with their moto "Potius mori quam foedari "(I prefer to die rather than to be dishonoured), it was probably commissioned for the eleventh Duke of Rohan, Alain-Charles-Louis de Rohan-Chabot (Paris, 1844- Paris, 1914), styled Prince of Léon, then, at death of his father, in 1893, 11th Duke of Rohan, was a French officer and politician. He was deputy of Morbihan (Brittany) from 1876 to 1914. The dish has a diameter of 27 centimeters and weighs 570 grams.
