the sockets are decorated with faces of grotesques.

the decorations of painted flowers are lush and of great color vivacity, you can recognize a myriad of flowers: roses, hollyhocks, tulips, lilies, dahlias... an astonishing diversity of flowers mixed with a very beautiful decoration to gold. all parts of these vases are decorated or gilded. the size is very important, they are 71 cm high
