



Bronze Medal Antoine Bovy Portrait Emperor Napoleon I Nineteenth Wood Frame



Description

Bronze medal representing the profile of the Emperor Napoleon I, signed A.Bovy*, in a wooden frame, from the 19th century. This medal is in good condition. Signed on the edge. A note: dirt on the medal, some scratches on the wood, see photos. * Antoine Bovy (1795 -1877) is a Swiss sculptor and medalist naturalized French. In 1824, he was sent to Paris to study with the sculptor James Pradier, professor at the École Supérieure des Beaux-Arts. In 1831, he brought his family to the French capital; from that year, he exhibited regularly at the Paris Salon, until 1865. In 1835, he was naturalized French and won a gold medal in engraving. In 1843, he was named Chevalier of the Legion of Honor. His brothers, Marc-Louis, director of the Geneva Mint, and Jules, struck the medals engraved by
