Description

Large Louis XVI late-century desk in carved and varnished blackened pearwood, rectangular in shape, opening on one side with two juxtaposed drawers, centered by an overhanging cul-de-lampe, adorned with an elegant drapery supported by solid rings. The sharp-edged linear belt features brass quarter-rounds on all sides. It is joined to the base by connecting dowels adorned with sculpted plant motifs. It rests on a base with four square-section legs. Each of these is adorned with filleted flutes and terminates in carved acanthus flower hooves resting on a small flattened bronze ball-shaped cap, while the top is punctuated by a trilogy of discs, crowned by a plain convex ring. The whole set is topped by a large tray with emboiture, sheathed in gilded morocco embossed with grecques and rais de
