



## Félicie Ransy-putzeys (1853-1929): Colossal Oil On Canvas



## Description

Very imposing oil on canvas from the very end of the 19th century by Félicie RANSY PUTZEYS (1853-1929), representing a wood carrier in a forest landscape, pastoral scene where we also see a woman praying in front of a Calvary. Gorgeous painting! Félicie RANSY PUTZEYS was a pupil of the Dutch landscape painter Willem Roelofs, as was her sister, Mariette Romiée, also an outstanding painter. The subjects that interest the artist the most are landscapes, in particular the Basse-Meuse and the Ardennes, as well as still lifes, especially still lifes of flowers. She was selected to be one of the female artists whose work was exhibited at the 1893 World's Fair in Chicago, USA. Other Belgian artists who have exhibited include Juliette Wytsman, Alice Ronner, Camille van Mulders, Georgette
