Silk carpet called "Isfahan Signed Hekmatnejad", created in Iran around the 1950s, during the time of the Shah. This rug is made in the great tradition of the famous Serafian rugs. It presents a beautiful presence with an oval field of ruby red on which is woven a complex network of intertwined floral motifs in various colors, forming a sublime starry floral rosette in shades of navy blue, ivory and sky. Large and elegant plant corners in ivory and sky, adorned with arabesques, add cachet to the whole. Four ivory and sky counter borders, with multicolored interlacing patterns, frame the main navy blue border, which is decorated with a dense tangle of polychrome flower stems. The signature is framed by traditional Iranian colors. This carpet is of great distinction. Technically, it is made of
