Jean Baptiste Boudard (born in Paris in 1710, died in Sala Baganza on October 23, 1768) was a French sculptor of the 18th century, who produced a large part of his work in Italy, in the Duchy of

Parma and in Rome. Jean-Baptiste was born in Paris in 1710, his father was director of the hallmarks of coins at the court of Louis XIV. He quickly demonstrated his artistic abilities and, in 1732, won the Prix de Rome for sculpture. He took a pension with the French Academy in Rome (Mancini Palace) and in 1736 he obtained the patent of sculptor and remained in Rome until 1740, studying the ancient works of the Capitoline and Vatican museums.
