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Ecole Polytechnique, while participating in the Salon de peinture et de sculpture de Paris from 1845.

He also illustrated many works on horses, such as L'Atlas statistics de la production des chevals en France (1850), the fruit of his collaboration with Eugène Gayot, director of the Haras du Pin (1840-1843) who later became Inspector General of the stud farms in charge of their management.
