"Very rare" set (in Guaita) complete with its 6 parts (including the last, "Appendix" reputed to be very rare) here bound in one volume. Each opens on a separate title page. Copy also complete with its two large engraved folding plates; embellished with a total of 16 figures. Binding decorated at the head and tail with a frieze depicting dolphins and crowned lilies. French translation prepared by Bernard Du Teil. "Collection of treatises on alchemy and spagyric medicine of the greatest rarity. Glauber deals in particular with the spirit of salt, to which he attributes many virtues, the manufacture of sugar and chemical wine, as well as the distillation of the various substances belonging to the three kingdoms of nature. (in Dorbon-Aine). "Illustrious alchemist in 1694, Johann Rudolf Glauber discovered admirable salt (sodium sulphate)". (in Caillet).
