Removable head This piece is inspired by the Terracotta Army (???, bingma yong, "figurines of warriors and horses buried with the dead") , or clay army, is a set of nearly eight thousand terracotta statues of soldiers and horses, representing the troops of Qin Shi Huang, the first emperor of China. They represent a form of funerary art, as they were buried in the tombs of the Qin Emperor's Mausoleum near the city of Xi'an, Shaanxi, in 210-209 BC.
