Description

Beautiful pair of ewers, sewn and shaped leather, bituminized interior for sealing and also solidity, elegant shape, inspired by Roman Antiquity. Each is mounted with a cast and chiseled black lacquered bronze handle, openwork and with superb floral attachments. One single piece of leather, wet or boiled, formed on a wooden mold, sewn by hand, bottom is a circular piece attached and sewn by hand.

The advantage of this process is lightness, solidity and soundlessness; the oldest models emerged in the Middle Ages, in the 16th century in Scotland, called Blackjacks. These seem to be French, Directoire period, and I suppose that they were part of the train of senior officers in the field, under the 1st Empire, without however having found any proof of this.
