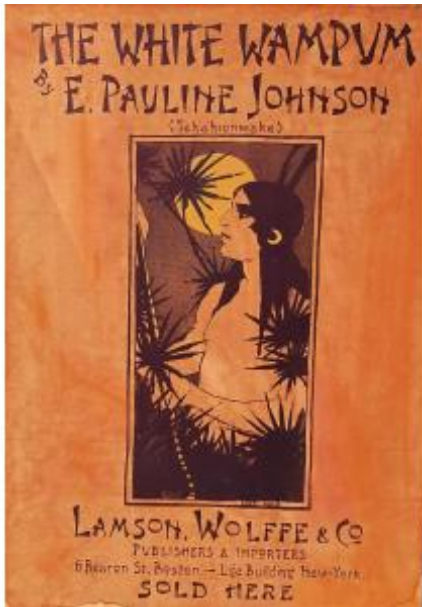

Ethel Reed, born in 1874 in Newburyport (Massachusetts) and died in 1912 in London, is an American artist, engraver, illustrator, designer and poster artist, one of the first women graphic designers of her time to have had, with her compatriot Alice Russell Glenn, an international stature.
