Our bronze rider Putchu Guinadji, sheathed in leather, was formerly used as a talisman. It is characteristic of the Kotoko ethnic group, established around Lake Chad, in the far north of Cameroon, in Chad and Nigeria. It is suspended to a leather bracelet - which is rarely found - decorated with a set of glass and bronze beads. Good condition.
