Protective figure presenting a warrior standing with his hands symbolically placed on the top of his penis. His face with the expression marked by the wide open mouth symbolizing a sign of challenge or the transmission of ancestral words, the headdress sculpted by a long cascading mat is characteristic of this people. Wood with old erosion of time traces of lichen and marks of use.
