Silver metal stamp and seed called "Hamburger Bean", Mucuna Sloanei. The stamp itself attached to the seed by a foliage motif is square (1.13 cm x 1.13 cm) and presents the letters C and E Probably French work Period around 1900 Good general condition

NB: This seed comes from Robust and climbing lianas, distributed throughout the American tropical world, in Africa and in the Indian Ocean. This species of Mucuna, used for a very long time in many Native American, American and Indian medicines, contains an amino acid precursor of dopamine that current medicine uses to treat Parkinson's disease.
