



Charles V Painting On Canvas



Description

Charles V known as "The Wise" (1334 - 1380), portrait in ceremonial dress and crowned. It is an oil on canvas with a large frame, re-canvased and very carefully remounted by a professional on a strong frame with keys. The paintings of the 17th century are very often made on strong canvases, the portrait proposed must certainly be part of a gallery of royal portraits intended for the knowledge and training of young nobles or bourgeois within the framework of a university or college . An examination of this portrait made with Wood's lamp tells us about his career: - No repainting on the face or on the clothes or on the crown, only two very light retouches are visible in the dark background of the canvas, they are invisible to the naked eye, no visible drilling or lack of material. The artist is anonymous but the
