This North African sword, known as the "Nimcha", is a remarkable piece from Morocco, dating from the early 19th century. Its slightly curved blade is covered with grooves widening towards the tip. The iron hilt consists of a pair of drooping quillons with bulging ends, an additional downward-curved arm, an angular knuckle guard, and a characteristic horn hilt, evoking the shape of a gun. Measurements: 85 cm

Additional Remarks: This Nimcha is an extraordinary illustration of Moroccan craftsmanship of the period. The blade demonstrates technical mastery, with its finely crafted grooves, while the iron guard and horn hilt add a distinctive touch to its aesthetic.
