



# Manufacture De Sèvres For The Duke Of Doudeauville - Biscuit Medallion Of Baron Von Humboldt



### Description

Royal Manufactory of Sèvres Medallion in hard porcelain biscuit Dimensions : D. 12.5 (cm.) Sèvres, circa 1829, 1830

Rare medallion depicting Baron Wilhelm von Humboldt in profile to the left and wearing the Order of the Black Eagle. This portrait is one of a series of portraits of crowned heads and influential figures made in circular medallions of various sizes by the Manufacture de Sèvres.

This portrait has the triple distinction of retaining its original frame, its commissioner's label and its Sèvres shop label. It was delivered for the Duc de Doudeauville on 14 June 1830, and is documented as such in the register of cash sales:

The second Duke of Doudeauville Louis-François Sosthène I de la Rochefoucauld was the son of Ambroise Polycarpe, a close relative of the Bourbons and 1st Duke of the name. He was appointed Director of Arts in the King's household in August 1824 and then Aide de Camps in May 1825. A legitimist, he returned to private life under the July Monarchy.

Condition report: excellent condition, very rare condition of preservation.
