Did you know? : The Victorian style developed in Great Britain during the reign of Queen Victoria between 1837 and 1901. The Victorian era is the age of imitation and reproduction, there was not a single dominant style but various influences which frequently combine motifs and elements from

earlier styles from architecture as well as antique furniture designs such as Gothic, Tudor, Elizabethan, Rococo, Neoclassical and others. The neo-Gothic style is inspired by medieval architecture and furniture and takes up its main motifs such as pointed and semicircular arches, fenestration, foliage, as well as draping. The furniture, for example, is strongly sculpted and even painted with illuminations which are inspired by the work of the 14th century.
