Description

Realism and expression larger than life for this portrait of an old man posing proudly on his armchair. the ideal Grandfather, elegantly dressed, a beautiful white mustache and beautiful piercing blue eyes, an attitude that challenges and stands out from the picture to arouse in us an emotion of sympathy and admiration. The work, in its good original condition, is offered in a beautiful Montparnasse frame which measures 65 cm by 56 cm and 46 cm by 38 cm for the canvas alone. A touching and sensitive work signed on the back.

Student of Magaud in Marseille, then of Cabanel, Bonnat and Saintpierre in Paris, he exhibited very assiduously at the Salon des Artistes Français from 1885 to 1934: "In a cellar and happy mother
