In 1842, David Haviland settled in Limoges, the world capital of porcelain, and created the Haviland workshop, the future cradle of a precious art and know-how. He made Limoges the cradle of limitless art, the world capital of porcelain. He began writing the history of the Haviland family, a name synonymous with the art of French luxury that continues to this day. In 1864, Haviland became the most important French porcelain factory.
