Queen's armchair used as an office chair, beautiful, very finely carved model, the back in a gendarme's hat, the armrests in leafy baluster, resting on 4 fluted legs. It is a refined production from the end of the Louis XVI period, a Parisian work of a good seat carpenter, but unfortunately not stamped, which does not allow the author to be identified with certainty. However, 3 years ago we sold a pair of Boulard chairs, very similar in construction:
